HANDWASHING (HAND HYGIENE) PROCEDURE

This Policy defines a procedure for effective handwashing (hand hygiene) which the Care Worker is required to practise to minimise the spread of infection when undertaking care duties at the service user's home:

- 1. Proper handwashing procedures are essential to reduce the spread of infection between the Care Worker and the service user. Good hand hygiene must be practised on the following occasions:
 - When arriving at a service user's home and before starting work;
 - Before and after each contact with a service user when undertaking personal care duties;
 - After taking off and discarding disposable protective clothing; e.g. aprons and gloves;
 - After contact with body fluids (vomit, blood, urine, faeces, secretions);
 - Before handling foodstuffs and preparing meals, snacks and drinks;
 - After using toilet facilities;
 - When finishing duties at the service user's home, just prior to departure.
- 2. Where deemed necessary the Care Worker will be supplied with small quantities of handwashing materials to take for use at service users' homes. These materials will include:
 - individual soap bars;
 - biocidal soap sachets;
 - nailbrush for personal use;
 - disposable paper towels.
- 3. 'World Health Organisation' Hand washing Procedure:

Follow the following 12-step process, which is summarised pictorially on page 2 of this Policy:

- Step 1: Wet hands with warm water that is comfortable to the touch, but not too hot.
- Step 2: Apply enough soap to cover all surfaces of the hand.
- *Step 3:* Rub hands palm-to-palm, remembering to wash between the fingers of both hands.
- Step 4: Rub the right palm over the left dorsum with interlaced fingers, and vice-versa.
- Step 5: Rub hands palm-to-palm, with fingers interlaced.
- Step 6: Rub backs of fingers to opposing palms, with fingers interlocked.
- Step 7: Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm, and vice-versa.
- *Step 8:* Rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards, with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm, and vice-versa.
- Step 9: Rinse hands thoroughly with water.
- *Step 10:* Dry hands thoroughly with a single-use paper towel or a clean hand towel.
- Step 11: Use paper towel to turn off tap OR use elbow-operated tap.

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Step 12: Hands are clean.
